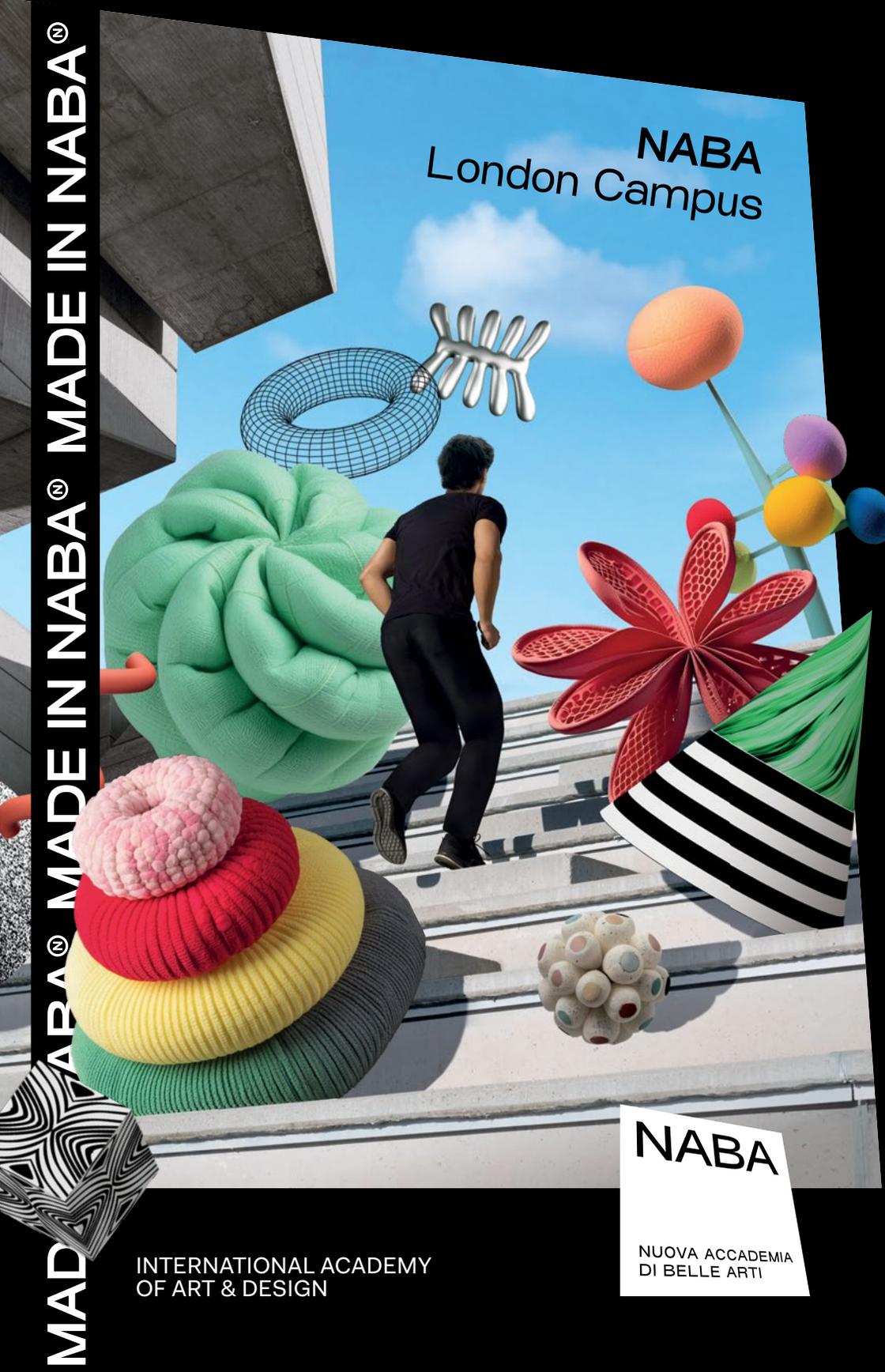

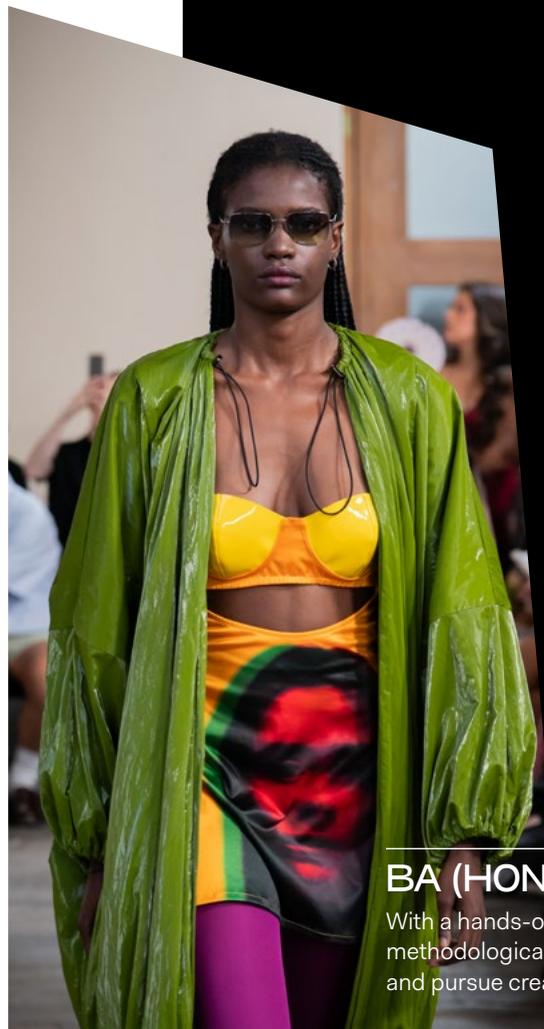

BA (HONS) Design

This BA combines theory and practice to develop sensitivity to objects and spaces, guiding students in applying contemporary design forms, critical thinking, technical skills, and methodologies in their own projects.



BA (HONS) Fashion Design

With a hands-on approach, this BA equips students with the language and methodological skills to interpret the complexities of the global fashion system and pursue creative and entrepreneurial careers in the industry.

BA (HONS) Fashion Marketing Management

This BA prepares future professionals to navigate the fashion system by connecting product development with marketing, communication, and distribution, while providing solid skills in culture, design and supply chain management.

Note: participants who successfully complete the Bachelors of Arts will receive a BA (Hons) Degree awarded by Regent's University London and a total of 360 UK credits (equivalent to 180 ECTS/CFA credits).
