COURSE DESCRIPTION

Visual storytelling Headquarters of ROME Session SESSION 3 - July 26 - August 5, 2022

Description

The course is part of visual design and introduces participants to a form of visual storytelling that manages to integrate the creation of images and textual content.

The urban experience, the contact with the city and its different souls will be the object of study, inspiration and research for students with the aim of creating a final project of personal and experimental visual story.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The course is aimed at students from Academies of Fine Arts or who generally have already gained experience in the field of illustration (one year of university studies in Visual Design) and who intend to deepen their knowledge of practical experience.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

During the course, combining practical exercises, moments of research and relying on case studies, the goal will be to create a final project of personal and experimental visual storytelling

OUTPUT

The student will be accompanied in the elaboration of a narrative and that will be able to express himself in a project with a different creative form (type design, lettering, booklet, visual storytelling, art book).
