#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Participants in this intensive hands-on course will be accompanied by an experienced documentary filmmaker in the conception and production of a short documentary product. The course is structured into three parts: introduction to documentary history and film-making techniques; pre-production and shooting with professional audio and video equipment; analysis and editing of the shot material to realize a rough-cut editing. The course is recommended for students wishing to concretely explore audiovisual production testing the expressive possibility of documentary film making.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Students will familiarize with language and professional technical instruments of documentary film-making, knowing at the same time aspects of Rome otherwise invisible to a visitor.

#### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This course is intended for students without any academic background in the specific subject area and for students attending their first years of university studies in Art and Design.

#### OUTPUT

The output of the course is a short rough cut documentary product, which students can bring back home, adding it to their professional or academic portfolio.



#### LIST OF MATERIALS AND TOOLS

A personal hard drive to archive the final product is the only instrument the students need to bring with them.

Professional cameras (Blackmagic Cinema Camera 6k pro and Sony FX30 equipped with professional Canon EF zoom lenses and Cinema lenses) and editing workstation will be provided by NABA.

#### ATTENDANCE POLICY

Class attendance is required for successful completion of the course. Attendance will be taken every class period.

Students should attend every lesson, and try to be in class at least 10 minutes before the beginning of class. On the last day of classes, instructors will issue a Certificate of successful attendance only to all students who completed at least 80% of the course.

#### **COURSE POLICY**

The Faculty of NABA takes Academic integrity seriously. Instances of academic dishonesty such as plagiarism won't be tolerated. Mobile phones will be kept switched off all the time during class. Use of laptop during classes for personal purposes is forbidden.

#### **TEACHING METHODS**

The course is based on a practical laboratory experience. In an environment of continuous confrontation within the group led by the teacher, students will interact with the reality of the city of Rome. They will face the essential steps of writing, filming and editing in order to create an original documentary short film. Teamwork will be essential to enrich everyone's path of creation and every student (thanks also to the reduced number of participants) will personally experiment the different roles needed to work as a professional film crew.
