TITLE – AREA Portrait drawing and painting (intermediate level)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course aims at teaching how to create a realistic portrait, or build on the students existing skills through practicing on drawing the human face, using photographs and live models. Students will work through a variety of exercises to develop precise techniques and a personal style, with a special emphasis on form and color, observing proportions, rendering color and shadow, and making quick sketches that convey a range of emotions. In its second phase the course aims to dive into different aspects of the realm of painting, by reflecting upon the methods used to represent subjects, and by experimenting with several techniques. Through the exploration of different styles and the use of several materials, students will acquire the knowledge needed not solely to learn about the realm of painting, but also to develop their own unique style.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Creating a set of sketches, copies and a final painting. To foster technical, observation and creative skills. Provide theoretical tools in order to approach the discipline from a contemporary perspective.

Creation of individual art works and the final presentation in front of an extended audience.

TEACHER'S SHORT BIO

Jacopo Rinaldi is an artist, educator and researcher. He studied in Rome and specialized in Milan with a thesis on the relationship between the Harald Szeemann archive and the architectural space that preserves it. Through drawing, photography and moving images he analyzes the relationship between memory, archive and architecture in the transmission of knowledge.

His works have recently been exhibited in numerous institutions, including: Museo MA*GA, Gallarate; Mediterranea 19, Young Artist Biennale, San Marino; Palazzo Strozzi, Firenze; PAV, Parco Arte Vivente, Turin; MACRO, Rome; Casa Testori, Novate Milanese; Casa Masaccio, San Giovanni Valdarno.

He took part in residency programs such as Visio (Lo schermo dell'arte), Arte Visione (Careof), Mahler LeWitt Studios/Viaindustriae, Viafarini, Fondazione Spinola Banna, Fondazione Pistoletto, Ramdom Association, dOCUMENTA (13), Little Constallation.
